With an intentional focus on putting students first, the WHRHS District will provide the resources, technology, and organizational change to achieve the following goals:

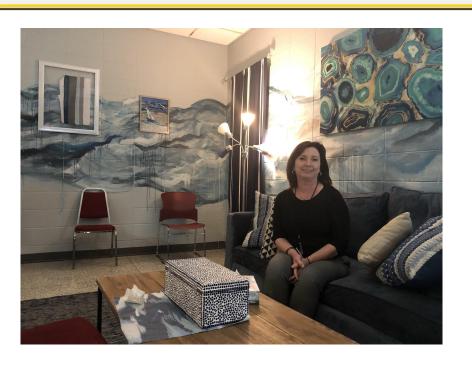
- Create and expand programs and services that enhance the social and emotional wellness of all students within a compassionate learning community.

**Performance Indicator 1C:** Two to four times per year, the Wellness Committee will facilitate a district-wide Healthy Edge Program focused on stress reduction, school spirit, and service.

Survey of faculty revealed 70.6% of respondents found infusing Wellness into lessons on an individualized schedule rather than a school wide day, was more effective.

**Performance Indicator 1D:** WHRHS will establish a district-wide Diversity Committee to examine and address issues regarding acceptance, respect, and support throughout the school community and beyond.

Performance Indicator 2A: Ensure that WHRHS provides students with the most suitable academic placements and pathways, articulately communicates students' academic achievement through the grading structure, and teaches students to make informed decisions about their opportunities so that they can engage fully in the college and post-secondary planning process.

## Strategic Plan Goal #3: Creative, Innovative, & Interdisciplinary Learning





**Performance Indicator 3A:** Develop and implement a set of Expected School-wide Learning Results (ESLR) which reflect the educational value and high expectations of this learning community for all WHRHS graduates

- ESLRs were approved by the BOE in October 2018 and posted on our website.
  - Reviewed in Academic Council and Department Meetings
  - Discussions focused on how rigor, integrity, engagement, SEL skills and the common good are all intentionally aligned for 21st century learners
  - ESLRs will provide opportunities/ guiding principles as we reflect/ critique and outline the development of our next strategic plan goals.



**Performance Indicator 3B:** Increase opportunities for cross-curricular learning through creative reallocation of time and purpose within our existing schedule and physical plant.

- Flex Days were expanded during the school year.
  - 10 Flex Days were scheduled throughout the school year-balanced for specific days, morning and afternoon.
  - Students were encouraged to see more than one teacher if the time permitted.
  - Student and teacher feedback was received about how to maximize flex time
  - o 12th graders requested opening additional spaces including gym and cafeteria.
- PLC groups were designed to encourage collaboration by faculty members across disciplines to study a problem of practice.
- Flexible classroom furniture encourages student/teacher interaction and other collaborative activities
- 3rd year of 1:1 Chromebooks, and teachers are learning more and more about new software and curricular online resources



**Performance Indicator 3C:** Enhance STEAM-related course offerings. Expand innovative opportunities for student learning within and beyond the classroom.
