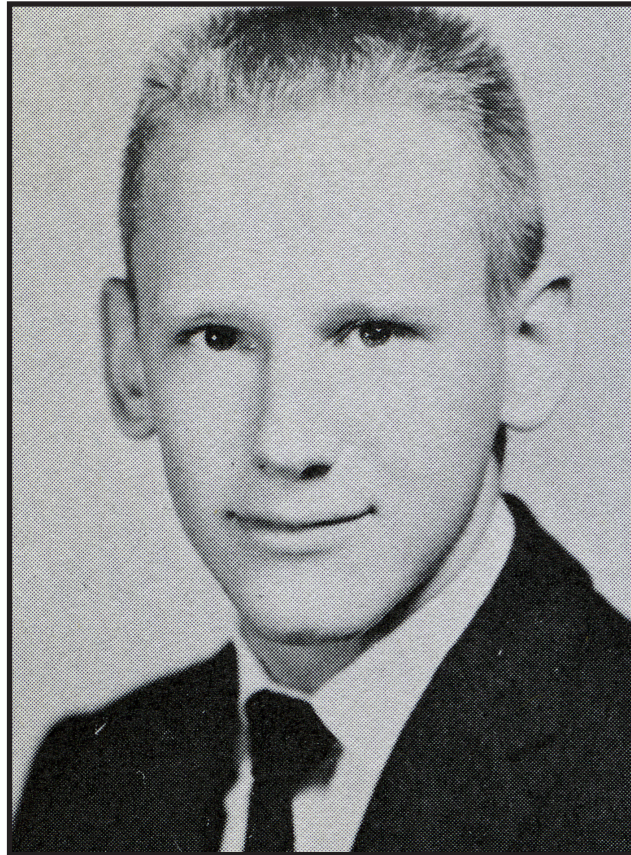

Jerry entered Watchung Hills Regional High School as a freshman the year the doors opened in 1957. From that point forward, Jerry was an integral part of the school as it grew and evolved - first as a student until his graduation in 1960 and then as a very involved alumnus and community member.

Although he lettered in both baseball and basketball, Jerry's induction reflects more than achievement on the field, on the court, or in his career; rather, Jerry is recognized as "an all around Hall of Famer."

After attending Lock Haven University, Jerry returned to Watchung and applied his diverse skills and attitude to his alma mater and to his community. Many know Jerry as the "Voice of Watchung Hills," a gifted announcer at many Watchung Hills tournament games in several sports.

Jerry also spent four years as the Vice President of the Watchung Hills Booster Club and moved it along during its formative years. He followed this with a term as Vice President of the Watchung Hills Alumni Association. His "roll up your sleeves" attitude and work ethic were also instrumental in the projects that funded and built dugouts for the baseball and softball fields.

But Jerry didn't reserve all of his "spare" time and efforts for WHRHS alone. He has been a member of the Watchung Borough Volunteer Fire Department for 44 years. His overall involvement, support and personal efforts earned him the Skyland Conference Community Service and Achievement Award in 2003.
