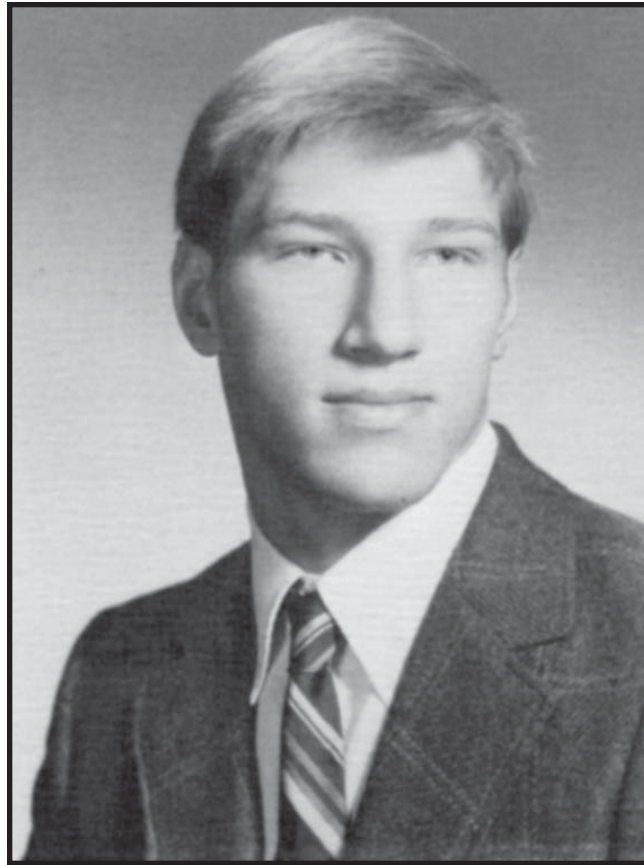


Watchung Hills Regional High School

Graduated from Watchung Hills Regional High School in 1972, Tom Glassic earned Mid-State Conference Honors as a football lineman. He attended the University of Virginia where he graduated with a BA in English and earned honors for his play on the football field. Tom was drafted by the Denver Broncos in 1976 and started as an offensive lineman on their first Super Bowl team in 1977. He played eight seasons for the Broncos until his retirement in 1985. Tom was a trailblazer in the NFL because he fought to win disability benefits for his numerous injuries incurred during his professional career. Other NFL players have benefitted from his efforts. He always believed his role was to defend his teammates on and off the field.

Upon retirement Tom pursued his childhood interest in toy soldiers. He has followed his passion and today stages many “instant replays” through re-enactments of battles from the Napoleonic and Civil Wars.
